## Student Work

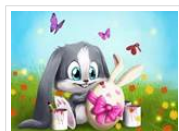

## NAPLAN 2017 (National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy)

The 2017 NAPLAN tests are fast approaching (May 9, 10 & 11).

### What is NAPLAN?

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual national assessment for all students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. All students in these year levels are expected to participate in tests in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. All government and non-government education authorities have contributed to the development of NAPLAN materials.

### Why do students do NAPLAN tests?

NAPLAN is the measure through which governments, education authorities, schools, teachers and parents can determine whether or not young Australians are meeting important educational outcomes in literacy and numeracy. The tests provide parents and schools with an understanding of how individual students are performing at the time of the tests. They also provide schools, states and territories with information about how education programs are working and what areas need to be prioritised for improvement.

NAPLAN tests are one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process; they do not replace the extensive ongoing assessments made by teachers about each student's performance.

## News from the Health Room

### Communication between Outside School Hours Care Services and Schools Regarding Medication

Please note that if your child attends outside school hours care (OSHC) including Family Day Care or Long Day Care Services, and requires medication to be administered at OSHC, it is a requirement under the Early Childhood Education and Care Regulations for the care provider to keep a medication record of time and date medication was last administered.

As the last dose of your child's medication may have been administered at school, school staff will only be able to provide this information to the service if the parent/carer consent has been obtained.

Therefore if your child does take medication at school and attends OSHC please ensure you have provided the school with a letter giving consent for the school to provide this information. When sending your letter please ensure you address it to the Principal, Attention: Health Room.

## Curriculum Corner

### Reading Improvement Agenda

It's hard to believe we have already reached the half way mark for Term 1! Students have settled into their classes and are establishing outstanding work routines.

In keeping with our School Improvement focus of Reading, last week we started familiarising ourselves with the next reading comprehension strategy in our learning cycle - Making Connections.

### What is making connections?

Efficient readers comprehend text through making strong connections between their prior knowledge and the new information presented in text. Activating each student's prior knowledge before reading is important. However, students need to be able to continue to use this strategy during reading to continually make connections as they read.

Making connections is when we make links between what we already know (our prior knowledge) and the text.

There are three kinds of connections we can make.

#### Text to self

This is when we connect the text to our own experiences.

#### Text to text

Text to text connections are when we compare the text we are reading to other similar texts. These texts could be books or visual texts such as a movie or a TV programme.

#### Text to world

This is when we connect what we are reading to things that really happen in the outside world.

### Parent / Teacher Interviews – date claimer

As part of our commitment to effective reporting, we are offering the opportunity for parents to meet with their teacher to share an understanding of the progress of their child. This is a timely opportunity to communicate and set goals before a formal report card is issued later in Term 2. This year Parent Teacher interviews will take place immediately after the school holidays on Wednesday 19 April in the school hall. Currently we are establishing the online booking system **PTO** that will guide your scheduling of an interview time. In the week beginning Monday 13 March you will receive a letter of information that contains a step by step guide on booking interview times.

The purpose of this meeting is to provide professional advice and support around the educational performance of your child:

- Provide individual student progress in areas such as reading, writing, maths and spelling
- Build partnerships (child/teacher, teacher/parent) and communication by encouraging parent teacher cooperation and building confidence
- Discuss personalised homework needs
- Discuss attendance and its direct link to learning
- Outline where do we go from here? What are our goals?


