Student Dress Code

The Morayfield East State School '*Student Dress Code*' provides guidance to our school community on the agreed uniform and standards for student personal presentation.

The uniform dress code reinforces in students a pride in their own appearance and instils a strong sense of belonging within Morayfield East State School and assists in developing pride when students are representing the school. Issues of equality, health and safety, and expense, are also factors that contribute to the establishment of the following *Student Dress Code*.

Any variation to the approved dress items must gain prior approval from the principal so an exemption can be provided.

Aim

The aim is to:

- Promote equality amongst all students
- Develop a sense of pride in and identification with our school
- Provide durable clothing that is cost effective and practical for our school environment
- Maintain and enhance the positive image of our school in the community

Benefits

Morayfield East State School believes as a school community that there are benefits in students following an agreed dress code and these benefits include:

1. **Appropriateness:** Guarantee that all students are dressed appropriately for school activities.
2. **Safety:** Uniforms are sun safe and promote a safe environment for learning by enabling easy identification of our students in the school grounds and while travelling to and from the school on a daily basis, as well as attending excursion off site.
3. **Equity:** Promotes a sense of equality and belonging amongst students in our school and eliminates the distraction of competition between students to wear expensive, fashionable or popular clothing, and avoids the pressure on parents to purchase fashionable clothing. This supports the focus of students to be on the teaching and learning taking place each day.

Endorsement

In line with the Education General Provisions Act 2006, school staff and the Parents and Citizen's (P&C) Association have endorsed the following *Student Dress Code* for all students.

Morayfield East State School has a dress standard in relation to:

- Clothing worn by students including headwear and footwear
- Students' personal grooming and hygiene

Uniform Shop

The Uniform Shop is located at the Tuckshop on the Morayfield East State School campus and all items are only available from school.

Uniforms can be purchased from 9:30am until 2:00pm each day Monday to Friday.

Additional hours will be advised during peak times at the beginning of the year.

Polo Shirt	Maroon with blue panels on each side and white piping. School logo is on the front left.	
Shorts/skorts	Unisex Maroon shorts and skorts with a blue panel on the left and white piping. School logo is on the left front left. Shorts have a draw string waste and zip pocket, skorts have an elasticised waist and zip pocket. Plain maroon shorts may also be worn.	
Hat Free bucket hat for Prep students sponsored by the P&C.	Reversible school and sports' house bucket hat with school logo, house colour and name. Willunga, Namoi, Yarrah and Mangiri Plain maroon wide-brimmed hat or bucket hat may also be worn.

Prep – 6 SPORTS' HOUSE POLO SHIRT (Unisex)

Students will be able to wear their house shirts on the following days:

- Class physical education lessons.
- Athletics carnivals, cross country and swimming carnivals, gala days.
- Intra and interschool sports' days and other days designated by the principal.
- Plain coloured t-shirts can be worn only for carnivals on school grounds.

Prep – Year 6 FOOTWEAR

Shoes and socks

Acceptable shoes are:

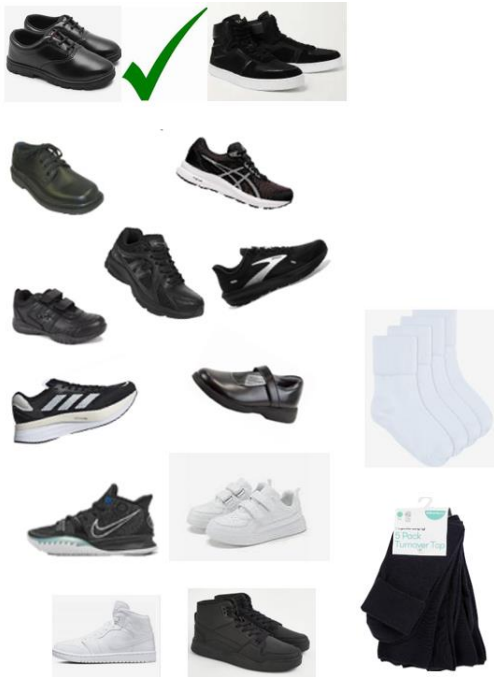
- Black school shoes
- Predominantly black sports joggers, trainers or high-tops, with black or white laces or Velcro.
- Predominantly white sports joggers, trainers or high-tops, with black or white laces or Velcro.

Other types of footwear like Ugg boots, sandals, gum boots, high heels, crocs, thongs, shoes with lights, glitter or cowboy boots are not acceptable.

Acceptable socks are:

- Plain black or white ankle socks.
- Plain black or white mid-rise socks

Knee high novelty socks or ankle socks with bright colours are not acceptable.





Prep – Year 6 FREE DRESS DAYS

Free Dress Days

The principal may designate free dress days. On these occasions, students are expected to wear clothing that is sun-safe, minimises skin exposure and meets standards of decency. Shoulders need to be covered, and clothing that exposes students' midriff or lower backs is not acceptable.

Student will be given a verbal warning. 2. Parents will be notified for consistent breaches of the dress code.
<p>Undergarments</p> <p>Long maroon tights may be worn under school uniform dresses.</p>	<p>Undergarments <u>must not</u> be worn over the school uniform or be visible.</p> <p>Permission to wear undergarments required for religious reasons requires prior approval of the principal.</p>	<p>The following consequences will apply if a student does not comply with these guidelines:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. <p>Hats</p> <p>Morayfield East State School expects that students wear their hats when outside the classroom at play breaks or participating in physical education lessons, to protect them from the sun.</p> <p><i>Students are expected to wear the approved sun safe school reversible bucket hat.</i></p>	<p>Baseball style caps and brightly coloured bucket hats or sun hats are not permitted.</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Students who do not have the appropriate sun safe hat will be excluded from activities in the sun. They will be required to stay in shaded areas undercover. 2. Students who do not have the appropriate sun safe hat will be ineligible to attend off campus activities in the sun.
<p>Footwear and Socks</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Students are required to wear fully enclosed footwear. - Shoes should be predominantly black or white with black or white laces or Velcro. - Socks must be plain black or white. 	<p>Multi-coloured, fluorescent-coloured sports shoes, socks or shoelaces are not permitted.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Shoes with high heels or platforms, thongs or slip-ons are unsafe and not permitted. 2. <p>Jewellery</p> <p>Students may wear the following approved items:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Watch (<u>excluding</u> smart watches) - Small plain sleepers or stud earrings - Medical alert bracelet or necklace - Items of significant religious/ cultural belief 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Other jewellery may be unsafe and become caught in play equipment or come into contact with another student causing injury. 2. Visible body piercing other than ears is not acceptable. 3. Jewellery worn for religious or cultural purposes <u>must be worn underneath clothing.</u> 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. A student wearing inappropriate jewellery will be required to remove the item and if necessary, give it to the teacher for safe keeping. 2. Repeat offenders will be warned and the inappropriate item will be confiscated, and parents are required to collect the item from the school.

<p>Nail Polish / Make-up / Temporary Tattoos</p> <p>Clear nail polish is permitted.</p>	<p>Students are not permitted to wear clearly identifiable nail polish, fake nails, fake eyelashes, cosmetic make-up or to have temporary tattoos.</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Students wearing coloured nail polish will be asked to remove it before returning to school the next day. 2. Parents will be contacted and requested to remove any makeup on their child. 3. Students will be required to cover up the tattoo until it fully fades away or is washed off.
<p>Hair</p> <p>Conservative hairstyles and natural colour</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Long hair is to be tied back, braided or plaited. This will minimise the transfer of head lice. 2. Extreme hairstyles (e.g. tracks, spikes, mohawks) or extreme colours (e.g. green, pink or purple rinses) are not permitted. 3. Hair ties, clips and accessories need to in school colours. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Students will be required to tie back long hair. 2. Extreme hair styles and dyed hair will result in a parent conversation with a member of the leadership team.
<p>Helmet</p> <p>Students riding bikes or scooters are required to wear a helmet.</p> <p><i>Bikes and scooters must be walked through the school grounds and students may then 'ride' these once outside the school gates.</i></p>	<p>All students riding to and from school are required to wear a secured bicycle helmet.</p>	<p>Students who fail to wear a helmet will not be permitted to ride their bicycle or scooter to/from school.</p>

<p>Free Dress Days</p> <p>The P&C conduct free dress days throughout the year to raise funds for community projects.</p> <p>Additional free dress days may be notified by the principal.</p> <p><i>Parents will be notified of special dress events like Book Week, in advance.</i></p>	<p>To participate in the free dress day students must observe the following guidelines:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Clothing that is sun-safe, with shoulders covered. - Clothing that is modest and suitable for regular school activities. - Clothing that has no offensive or obscene language or messages. - Closed in footwear. - No jewellery, make-up or fingernail polish contrary to the school's dress code. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Required to return home to change 2. Remove offending jewellery items 3. Withdrawn from non-curriculum school activities.

Consequences of Non-Compliance

1st Offense: Warning and Reminder

2nd Offense: Dress Code Non-compliance breach note sent home

3rd Offense: Referred to Deputy Principal – Parents are contacted by the Deputy Principal to discuss reasons and reinforce school expectations. Support by Student Support Officer may be enacted at this time

4th Offense: Referred to Deputy Principal – Possible suspension (for continuous non-compliance)

Notes:

1. Non-compliance of the Student Dress Code associated with genuine financial hardship, medical issues or a disability, will be considered on a case-by-case basis. The principal or their nominee is the sole authority in this matter.
2. Parents and Carers will be notified in writing if their child consistently breaches the school's student dress code.
3. This policy will be reviewed as part of the Department of Education school review cycles.
